At the request of Cache County Executive, Craig Butters, I am serving on the Solid Waste Advisory Board. At our last meeting we were updated on the operations of the solid waste organization.

The new location for solid waste is north of Clarkston and is titled North Valley Landfill. The bid for the construction of the site was awarded to Whitaker Construction for \$1,249,515 and the contract for road construction to the landfill was awarded to Staker Parsons for \$3,797,687.

The recycling operation is having some difficulty in sorting items sent to them and we were requested to advise our citizens that some waste items should not be included. Following are the top 7 most common contaminants and we request that you please do not put them in the blue can:

Plastic bags * Food Wrappers * Tissues

Styrofoam * Pizza boxes * Disposable dishware

Plastic that's not labeled #1 through #7
