complaints from neighbors except one. He doesn't see the justification behind his neighbor's recent complaint. In regards to the parking issue, he said there are far more cars that pull over on his road for school than for his business. Mr. Malmstrom asked for public comments.

Jerry Pence lives north of the Kraus home. They moved in nine years ago and asked if Mr. Kraus hadn't had a license all that time. Commissioner Malmstrom said he did have a business license but not a conditional use permit, which he needs based on his outdoor displays. Mr. Pence said since the city issued a license, one would assume the city was fine with Mr. Kraus' business.

There was confusion about what the issue was. Councilmember Wright explained that the city's current ordinance requires a CUP for Mr. Kraus' use. What we don't know is what the law was when he started his business. He hasn't been able to show proof of when the business started. The timing is critical since there is a past ordinance that would allow his use and another one that wouldn't. Without proof Mr. Kraus needs to fall under the current ordinance. Mr. Kraus always thought his business was legal. It wasn't until a recent neighbor asked the city to see his CUP, which they didn't have and Mr. Kraus couldn't prove, that it became an issue. It seemed the best way to take care of the situation was to have him apply for a CUP under the current ordinance.

Mr. Kraus said he found some business information from spring of 1983.

Commissioner Wright read from the 1983 Ordinance which first addressed Home Occupations, but not CUPs. He interpreted from this that Mr. Kraus' business wouldn't have been allowed then because his full business wasn't contained inside his home.

Commissioner Wright read from the 1971 Ordinance, which didn't address home occupations at all. If there were proof that the business was in place before 1983, they wouldn't need to be here.

Ruthann Nelson said she grew up in River Heights and has lived across the street from Mr. Kraus for 14 years. She remembers his business always being there. Her family has never had an issue with his business and felt it's been an asset to the neighborhood.

Commissioner Petersen said he has a state contractor's license but it doesn't take care of his city business license. He said people need to find out the rules and abide by them.

Mr. Kraus said he's always had a city business license for his business. He was unaware he needed anything more.

Condon Hansen asked what the 1997 ordinance said. Commissioner Malmstrom read from it, which would require Mr. Kraus to have a CUP based on his distribution of products.

Commissioner Schaub asked if the issue was the display of the equipment from the street. Commissioner Malmstrom stated the biggest concern, which he's aware of, is traffic from the business. Ruthann Nelson said there are far more cars associated with the school than Mr. Kraus' business.

Commissioner Petersen stated the current ordinance says there should be no outdoor displays or signs. Mr. Kraus asked if he could continue these things since he's been doing it for so long.

Commissioner Malmstrom read from the sign ordinance, which said a home occupation business could have a sign that was window or wall mounted.

Commissioner Schaub felt the playground equipment was too close to the road.

Mr. Kraus thought he could produce proof that he was in business in 1982. Councilmember Wright asked him if he really wanted to pursue this avenue, rather than get the CUP.

'Mike Nelson said the real issue is that a neighbor doesn't like Bob Kraus and didn't even show up to the meeting. He said Mr. Kraus operates a good clean business. He's been fair and gotten his business license every year. Mr. Nelson thinks the city should work on how to help businesses succeed, not make it hard for businesses.

Commissioner Malmstrom assured the city wasn't trying to shut the business down. Because this issue had attorneys involved, the city needed to figure out if the business was legal, and if not to get it to that point. It certainly has involved going through some hoops but it means the city will be protected, as well as Mr. Kraus.

Commissioner Malmstrom addressed the sign ordinance, which stated signage needs to be wall or window mounted.

Ruthann Nelson asked if the sign being attached to the swing set would count. Commissioner Petersen reiterated, 'wall or window mounted.'

Commissioner Malmstrom doesn't believe the sign is bad or obtrusive, but asked Councilmember Wright what could be done besides changing the ordinance. Mr. Wright guessed that when the ordinance was written it was for businesses taking place inside the home. He suggested the Commission could make sign ordinance compliance as one of the conditions. In the meantime, the city's attorney can be consulted on his interpretation.

Commissioner Petersen asked which ordinance they would go by. Councilmember Wright answered it will be the current one. Mr. Petersen asked for the current ordinance to be read. 'Direct sales and distribution' puts Mr. Kraus into a CUP.

Commissioner Schaub noticed Mr. Kraus owns two properties and has his equipment basically on 609 South 600 East. His home is at 562 E 600 South.

Commissioner Schaub moved to "approve the Conditional Use Permit submitted by Robert Kraus for his Trampolines and Plaything business located at 562 East 600 South and 609 South 600 East, with the conditions of complying with the sign ordinance and customer parking will be on or adjacent to his properties." Commissioner Zollinger seconded the motion, which passed with Malmstrom, Pitcher, Schaub and Zollinger in favor. Petersen was against.

The meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
