Storm Water

The primary purpose of storm drains are to carry rainwater and snowmelt away from developed areas to prevent flooding. As water flows over the ground it picks up a variety of pollutants which then flow to local storm water ponds, ditches and rivers.

River Heights City is committed to improving water quality and reducing the amount of pollutants entering waterways.

To keep your monthly storm water fee from rising, please help the city by keeping your gutters free of dirt and debris.



Solicitor Ordinance

Remember, each door-to-door salesperson must wear a RHC issued permit/badge to identify they have gone through the city's application and approval process. **Please call the City with the company name and location if they cannot show they are licensed through RHC.**

Confidence Report

The United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Utah Division of Drinking Water requires the city to perform many tests on our culinary water to ensure that it is safe for you to drink and use. A copy of the Consumer Confidence Report is available for review on the city's website.

Sump Pumps

It is unlawful for sump pumps to be connected to the City's sewer system. (Refer to RHC Code 11-6-5:B.)

Your help is needed to minimize sump pump water from being discharged into the city's sewer system, especially during the spring run-off. Unfortunately, illegal discharge into the sewer can result in the sewer system operating at maximum capacity and could cause sewage to back-up into your home. River Heights also has to pay Logan City for every gallon of wastewater we send through their treatment system. A sump pump could cost the city thousands in extra treatment charges.

Planning to Build Something on Your Property?

Don't forget to get a Zoning Clearance Permit before you build. Applications are available at the City Office or website. Codes are in place to protect you, as well as your neighbors and future property owners. Some projects that must have a permit before building are: fences, sheds, decks, storage buildings, home additions, porches, garages (attached and detached) and free standing solar panels.

Garbage and Recycle Pickup

Please place your cans at least 4 feet apart, especially during the winter. This is safer for you and helps the truck operators.

Many of the recycling containers have a sticker under the lid that tells you what can be recycled. This sticker is now out of date. New stickers are available at the city office and look like this . . .
