

85 Years of River Heights History

1934-2019

The first name given to River Heights was "Dry Town." This was because there was no natural flowing streams or springs in the area. Even after the town was named River Heights, the old timers in Providence would still refer to it as Dry Town. This made the people of River Heights pretty upset and it nearly came to fist fights on more than one occasion.

Sewer Rate Increase: As of April 1, 2019 sewer rates will increase by \$6/month, based on current costs associated with the new Logan City wastewater treatment facility.

Storm Water

The primary purpose of storm drains are to carry rainwater and snowmelt away from developed areas to prevent flooding. As water flows over the ground it picks up a variety of pollutants which then flow to local storm water ponds, ditches and rivers.

River Heights City is committed to improving water quality and reducing the amount of pollutants entering waterways.

To keep your monthly storm water fee from rising, please help the city by keeping your gutters free of dirt and debris.


Planning to Build Something on Your Property?
