#### **Emergency Preparedness**

The time to prepare is now!

The River Heights Emergency Preparedness Committee encourages you to start preparing your family for any sort of emergency that could befall your family.

For the month of April: Purchase an extra back-pack to use for a 72 hour kit. One for each member of the family is advised, but if you can only start with one do it! Also put some water bottles in it and a basic first aid kit.

For the month of May: Purchase food to put in your backpack you bought in April, and add some extra clothes.

For the month of June: Purchase personal care items and extras items (diapers) you need for children and put it in your backpack.

Each door-to-door salesperson must wear a RHC issued permit/badge to identify they have gone through the city's application and approval process. Please call the City with the company name and location if they cannot show they are licensed through RHC.

Don't forget to get a Zoning Clearance Permit before you build. Applications are available at the City Office or website. Codes are in place to protect you, as well as your neighbors and future prop-



erty owners. Some projects that must have a permit before building are: sheds, decks, storage buildings, home additions, porches, garages (attached and detached) and free standing solar panels.

Fences no longer require a permit, however, check our website to make sure you build it according to code.

### **Consumer Confidence Report**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Utah Division of Drinking Water requires the city to perform many tests on our culinary water to ensure that it is safe for you to drink and use. A copy of the Consumer Confidence Report is available for review on the city's website.
