Sewer Rate Increase

The River Heights City Council has adopted another sewer rate increase to keep up with Logan City's yearly increases over the next 10 years. Effective July 1, 2018 the sewer rate will be **\$32.10/month**.

Garbage Rate Increase

Logan City has raised sanitation rates, which passes through to River Heights residents. Therefore, the City Council has adopted the new monthly can rates :

90 gallon	\$19.15
60 gallon	\$16.90
Greenwaste	\$ 5.00

90 and 60 gallon can charges includes \$3 for recycling and a \$1 administrative fee.

These rates will be effective July 1.

Sprinkling Systems

Current state plumbing code requires a backflow preventer on all underground sprinkling systems. The backflow preventer is a device that prevents impurities or contaminants from being drawn into the drinking water system. Many sprinkling systems already have the proper backflow preventer installed and need only be tested annually. Others may not meet state and local regulations and may need to be replaced with the proper backflow preventer. The regulations also require a state certified backflow technician test the backflow preventer annually. If you have questions call Clayton Nelson at 752-2646 x2.



Greenwaste Dumpster

Logan City provides the greenwaste dumpster north of the cemetery. They ask the following:

"If the green waste drop site roll-off is full please **do not place the materials on the ground** surrounding the dumpster. This hinders our ability to empty the dumpster. If the green waste dumpster is full, we ask that residents take the materials to the Logan City Green Waste Facility at 153 N 1400 W in Logan for no charge. The green waste dumpsters are emptied daily Monday-Friday

Storm Water

The primary purpose of a storm drain is to carry rainwater and snowmelt away from developed areas to prevent flooding. As water flows over the ground it picks up a variety of pollutants which then flow to local storm water ponds, ditches and rivers.

River Heights City is committed to improving water quality and reducing the amount of pollutants entering waterways.

Please keep your curbside gutters free of debris.
